You can mail, fax to 405.359.9002, bring the forms to our office or upload them to us from your tax portal. If returning by email, please password protect the document.

We offer our clients access to their tax returns in a safe and secure online portal that is available 24/7. This is our preferred method of providing completed tax returns.

It is completely private and secure. Once you are set up, it is as easy as logging in to your client portal using a secure ID and password. For added security, portal access requires Multifactor Authentication (MFA). Instructions are provided when you register the portal.

On your portal, you can:

- Get copies of your tax returns; no need to call us or hunt for your paper copy.
- View and pay your invoice.
- Securely send us your QuickBooks files, financial statements, or any other files.
- Store important documents that you upload to the portal.

Our tax preparation process is as follows:

When your tax documents are received, your tax return will be prepared and reviewed. A copy of your tax return will then be placed on our secure web portal for you to review. You will receive a call to go over the results. After you review and approve the returns, you can sign the returns electronically. If you are married filing jointly, we must have a unique email address for you and your spouse. You will receive an email that verifies your identity and then sign the forms. You will receive a separate email with a link to access the completed return and invoice on the portal.

The returns will be e-filed when the e-file signature forms are received by our office. You will receive an email from the IRS and applicable state acknowledging acceptance of your returns.

The invoice is due upon receipt. We accept cash, checks or credit cards.

If we have your original documents, you will receive a call letting you know your documents are ready to be picked up. If you prefer, we can shred your documents. Action Items can be printed upon request.

2022 Income Tax Return Annual Engagement Letter

Airington & Associates appreciates the opportunity to work with you and is pleased to provide you with the professional services described below. This letter confirms our understanding of the terms and objectives of our engagement and the nature and limitations of the services we will provide. We will perform our services in accordance with the Statements on Standards for Tax Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. We require that this letter be read, signed, and returned to our office prior to the start of your tax return preparation.

We will prepare your 2022 federal and state income tax returns from the information which you will furnish to us. We will not audit or otherwise verify the data you submit, although it may be necessary to ask you for clarification of some of the information. We will furnish you with questionnaires and worksheets to guide you in gathering the necessary information. Your use of such forms will assist in keeping the fee to a minimum.

It is your responsibility to provide all the information required for the preparation of complete and accurate returns. You represent that there is adequate substantiation to support deductions for any expenses claimed on your return. Our work in connection with the preparation of your income tax returns does not include any procedures designed to discover defalcations and/or irregularities, should any exist. We will not and cannot detect theft, fraud, and or embezzlement. You should retain all the documents, canceled checks, and other data that form the basis of income and deductions. These may be necessary to prove the accuracy and completeness of the returns to a taxing authority. You have the final responsibility for the income tax returns and, therefore, you should review them carefully before you sign them. You give us the right to shred any documents you provide us if they are not picked up within a year of this signed engagement.

The original filing due date for your income tax returns is April 18, 2023. Please have your tax information to us no later than **March 1, 2023** (even if you have missing information). After this date, we may not be able to complete your tax return by the tax deadline and may have to file an extension. An extension does not extend the time to pay taxes. If you owe tax and do not pay the amount due by April 18, 2023, you will owe interest. You may also be charged penalties.

US citizens are required to report worldwide income on their US tax return. If you and/or your entity have a financial interest in any foreign accounts, you are responsible for filing Form FinCen 114 required by the U.S. Department of the Treasury on or before April 18, 2023. Please make note of the new filing deadline.

We are required to electronically file all federal and state individual income tax returns. We will provide you with a copy of the income tax returns for your review prior to electronic transmission. After you have reviewed the returns, you must provide us with a signed authorization (Form 8879 & applicable state form) indicating that you have reviewed the return and that, to the best of your knowledge, you feel it is correct. We cannot transmit the returns to the taxing authorities until we have the signed authorizations. Therefore, if you have not provided our firm with your signed authorizations by April 18, 2023, your return cannot be timely filed, even though it might already have been completed. In that event, you will be responsible for ensuring that any payment due

with the extension is timely sent to the appropriate taxing authorities. You will also be responsible for any additional costs our firm incurs arising from the extension preparation. An E-file authorization signature and a payment in full are required before any tax return can be electronically filed or released.

In the interest of facilitating our services to you, we utilize a secure Web Portal. This is the safest method of providing tax returns to our clients and we strongly suggest you take advantage of the Portal. Your use of this Portal must comply with our standards of use, and as owners of the portal, we retain the right to limit and/or deny the use of the Portal for inappropriate purposes. Portal access requires Multi-Factor Authentication.

In connection with this engagement, we may communicate with you or others via email transmission. As emails can be intercepted and read, disclosed, or otherwise used or communicated by an unintended third party, or may not be delivered to each of the parties to whom they are directed and only to such parties, we cannot guarantee or warrant the emails from us will be properly delivered and read only by the addressee. Therefore, we specifically disclaim and waive any liability or responsibility whatsoever for the interception or unintentional disclosure of emails transmitted by us in connection with the performance of this engagement. In that regard, you agree that we shall have no liability for any loss or damage to any person or entity resulting from the use of email transmissions, including any consequential, incidental, direct, indirect, or special damages, such as loss of revenues or anticipated profits, or disclosure or communication of confidential or proprietary information. For your protection, we request that you use the portal or a password to protect, any sensitive material you send to us. We have implemented all security data measures, per guidance, from experts in the field of information technology. In the event of the loss of personal data by a data breach, we will notify all parties involved. We will not be responsible if an event occurs through no fault of the firm.

All invoices are due and payable upon presentation. Billings become delinquent and finance charges will accrue at 1.5% per month if not paid within 30 days of the invoice date. If billings are not paid within 60 days of the invoice date, we may at our discretion, stop all work until your account is brought current, or we may withdraw from this engagement until your account is brought current. In the event we stop work or withdrawal from this engagement because of your failure to pay on a timely basis for services rendered, we shall not be liable for any damages/penalties incurred as a result of our ceasing to render services. Per IRS Security Summit requirements, if you would like to have a refund direct deposited or a balance due debited from your bank account, you will need to verify the name of the financial institution, routing transit

number, account number, and type of account.

We have spent many years becoming very knowledgeable and educated in tax and accounting matters. In addition, we are required to continue our education annually to maintain our licenses.
